< Administration and Finances

In 2001/2002, LASA operated on a budget of \$290,000. The Law Society of Alberta provided the core grant of \$110,000.

The audited financial statement includes project grants and expenses and shows revenues increased by 1.5% and expenses increased by 4.5%, resulting in a small surplus of \$2,078. As always, fundraising efforts must continue to ensure that the day-to-day archival and administrative needs of LASA are met.

LASA is a registered charity and holds category “A” status under the Cultural Properties Export and Import Act.

Project Funding

For the fiscal year of 2001/2002 LASA received a total of \$37,556 in project funding or commitments from outside sources to fund specific projects.

Alberta Law Foundation

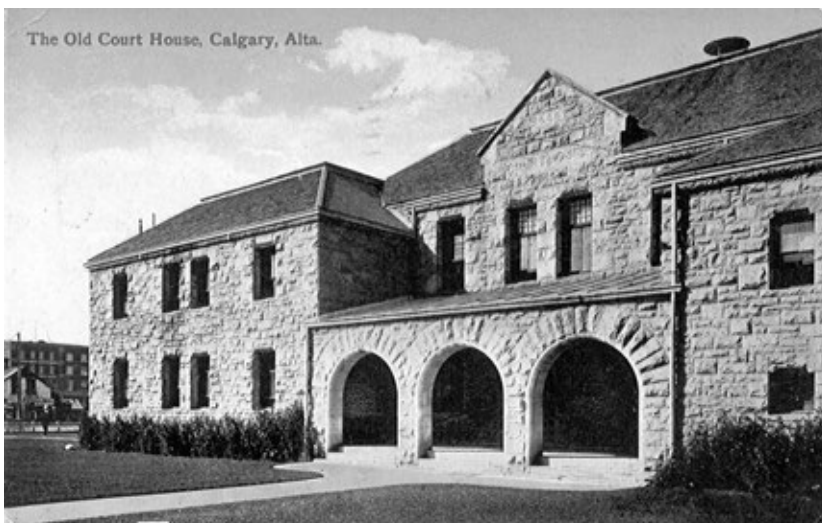
The Alberta Law Foundation funded a project in the amount of \$25,000 to digitize the minutes of the Law Society of Alberta. \$19,353 was received in this fiscal year.

Alberta Historical Resources Foundation

\$7,675 of a \$15,000 grant has been received so far to record the oral histories of members of the Bar in the Peace River and Grande Prairie areas.

Archives Society of Alberta

\$1,350 of a \$1,800 grant was received from the ASA to digitize LASA’s photo archives. These will be available for researchers on the Alberta InSight located on the ASA website www.archivesalberta.org.

2002 Annual Campaign

The purpose of the annual campaign is to raise funds to cover operating expenses for the current and next fiscal year. Staff and volunteer supporters set out to achieve the 2001/2002 goal of \$55,000 through two major drives: a direct mail campaign and membership, and the 2002 Historical Dinners and auctions. The total of the 2002 campaign was \$63,370.

Direct Mail Campaign

LASA mailed out over 8,500 personalized appeal letters and donor cards to the Alberta legal community in April, 2002. Combined with other contributions throughout the year, the profession responded with \$41,735 in direct donations.

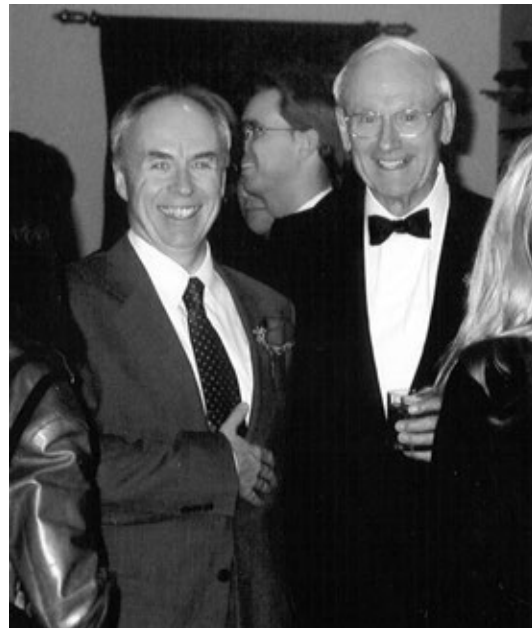
2002 Historical Dinners

Historical dinners were held in both Edmonton (October 17th) and Calgary (October 23rd) to honour lawyers who were professional athletes. Speakers for the Edmonton dinner were Jack Agrios, Q.C., Hon. William Haddad, Q.C., Shauna Miller and David Syme, Q.C.. In Calgary, Willie deWit, Doug Mitchell, Q.C. and Jim Gladstone (in place of Diane Jones-Konihowski) were the speakers. Ticket sales for both dinners reached \$15,460 and \$6,175 was made at the Silent Auctions. Unfortunately, LASA will need to increase ticket prices for future dinners as the costs for holding such events has increased significantly.

Alberta Legal Heritage Fund

In 1997 LASA established the Alberta Legal Heritage Fund in the Edmonton Community Foundation, The Calgary Foundation and the Medicine Hat Community Foundation. In 1998, funds were established in the Community Foundations of Red Deer, Lethbridge and Grande Prairie. Funds from casinos held in 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2002 were also added to the Alberta Legal Heritage Fund in each community. The income from the fund will be used to ensure the future preservation of legal archives in Alberta. In the past year \$7,785.39 was received in Endowment Income.

Membership

Membership stood at 318 on October 31, 2002, an increase from last year's total of 312. Revenues from membership and donations for 2001/2002 was \$41,735, a slight increase from last year's amount of \$41,231. The average donation, including membership, in 2000/2001 was nearly \$132; in 2001/2002, it was \$131.

Annual General Meeting

On March 13, 2002, LASA held its Annual General Meeting at the Prince of Wales Armoury in Edmonton. Members of the current Board, Graham Price, Q.C., Garth Fryett, Q.C., and Gordon Hoffman, Q.C. allowed their names to stand. The Hon. William A. Stevenson, O.C, Janice Agrios, Donald Bishop, Q.C., and Sandra Petersson were elected to the Board.

Hon. Mr. Justice E.A. Marshall was the guest speaker and presented his recent research on the legal history of the Peace River judicial district from the 19th Century.

^ < Archives



LASA operates a province-wide archives program and facility based in the Law Society of Alberta offices in Calgary. The main components of the archives function are:

- acquiring and appraising records of the legal community
- arranging, describing, and constructing finding aids for records
- storing and conserving records

Facilities and Conservation

LASA's administrative and research office and storage vault have been reduced in space by about 25% since 1995. Currently, approximately 80 metres of unprocessed records are now stored in warehouse conditions at the Law Society's off-site storage space. LASA is in increasing need of additional environment-controlled facilities.

LASA will need to seek other secure and proper archival space to house its growing collection.

Acquisitions

LASA acquired 34 accessions in 2002, amounting to nearly 14 linear metres of textual records, 93 photographs, 33 sound disks, 30 videos, 24 computer disks and 2 sound cassettes. Currently LASA's holdings exceed 500 metres. Noteworthy acquisitions in 2002 include:

Hon. Mr. Justice William G. Morrow. Dates of material: 1966-1976

The caveat, submissions, reference material, exhibit books, reasons for judgment, factums, case on appeal volumes, and the final ruling of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Canada relating to the landmark *Caveat* case on Indian land claims. Justice Morrow was deeply interested in the history of the Canadian north and the history of native peoples. When this legal issue was put before him, he saw an opportunity to collect and preserve evidence relating to the life and the circumstances surrounding the signing of treaties. These papers contain a unique oral history of native people reciting their reminiscences of what their ancestors told them, what they understood the treaties to mean, and what had been conveyed by the officials who brought the treaties to them to sign.

Hon. Mr. Justice Ernest Brown Wilson. Dates of material: 1952-1958

A valuable collection of letters belonging to the late Justice Ernest Brown Wilson. Several letters document the need for a new court house in Edmonton and renovations proposed to the old land titles office. Correspondence written to and received from Campbell McLaurin, Gordon Egbert, J.M. Cairns, J. Sissons, Neil Primrose, and others concerning various court matters is included. Some letters from Campbell McLaurin were written from London, England during the 1957 Diesel Engines Commission.

Leslie M. Diamond. Dates of material: 1963-1994

Conciliation Board, Arbitration and Adjudication case files including official appointment papers, background information relating to disputes, submissions made by opposing sides, and awards presented by Chairman Leslie M. Diamond. Matters relating to the Alberta Labour Act, the Canada Labour Code, and other private disputes and grievances are included.

Lethbridge Bar Association. Dates of material: 1928

Consists of a dinner menu from a Lethbridge dinner held at the Marquis Hotel on December 14, 1928 organized by the law firm Ostlund and Company (so-called "solicitors for plaintiff"). The humorous "particulars" on the menu read in part: "In the High Court of Good Fellowship, The Lethbridge Bar Association plaintiff and The Alberta Law Society et al. defendants".

Arrangement and Description

The activity of arranging and describing archives involves: accessioning the records to gain physical control; completing a preliminary listing of the material to facilitate access to the holdings; storing material for long-term preservation; and producing finding aids compliant with the *Rules of Archival Description* to aid researchers. A group of records from one person or organization is described in archival terms as a Fonds. Detailed descriptions of all acquisitions received by LASA are available on the automated ACCESSION database. Approximately 50% of LASA's holdings are archivally arranged and described at the fonds and series level on the FONDS database. Of the 85 fonds described, most are processed to the file and item level and include a finding aid available for researchers.

In the past year the records of The Hon. Mr. Justice David C. McDonald were processed and a complete inventory entered into the FONDS database. LASA also received a grant from the Archives Society of Alberta (ASA) to scan our extensive photo archive. These can now be viewed at *Alberta InSight* on the ASA website. By mid-2003 LASA should have most of its fonds level descriptions on-line on the Archives Network of Alberta (ANA). These can be viewed on the ASA website (www.archivesalberta.org) or via links from LASA's website (www.legalarchivessociety.ab.ca).

Reference Services

LASA maintains an automated reference system which provides access to information on lawyers, legal organizations, and judges in the province and supports research projects such as family histories, case law, and biographies. Staff perform limited searches and interpretation of material in response to reference inquiries.

LASA received 117 requests for information relating to or taken directly from its holdings. Some of these requests involved extensive in-house research of archival material over a period of weeks; others were simple requests for information provided in a matter of minutes over the telephone. The information has been used for locating practice files, to complete genealogical research, or to produce historical publications. The types of researchers were broken down as follows: Original Donors - 21; Legal Community - 37; Academic Community - 14; Private Researchers - 37; Media - 4; Other Archives/Libraries - 4.

< Other Heritage Programs

Exhibits and Interpretation

LASA has developed a province-wide system of touring interpretive exhibits in Alberta's courthouses which make use of documents and artefacts to educate the public about the role of the legal community in the history of Alberta. Displays can be viewed at the Edmonton and Red Deer Courthouses, the Court of Queen's Bench in Calgary and the Provincial Court Building in Calgary.

Displays celebrating *Lawyers in Sport* accompanied the 2002 Historical Dinners in both Edmonton and Calgary.

LASA completed an extensive digitization project of its photographic records. LASA images and those from other archives in Alberta can now be viewed at the Archives Society of Alberta *Alberta InSight* webpage. Publications

Work continues on three historical publications. LASA has approached University of Calgary Press for assistance in publishing *Foundations of Justice: Alberta's Early Courthouses*. Other projects include a book explaining the court system in Alberta complete with sketches by a local artist, and *The Middle Kingdom: Prince Rupert's Land, The Northwest Territories and Prairie Provinces, 1670 - 1940*, a collection of essays resulting from a conference held at the University of Calgary in 1997.

LASA assisted in the distribution of the book *Milt Harradence: The Western Flair* written by Christopher D. Evans.

Archetypes

Two issues of LASA's newsletter, *Archetypes*, were distributed to all members of the Law Society throughout the year. Volume 10.2 featured a condensed version of the talk given by Professor David J. Bercuson at the 2001 Historical Dinner entitled *War and War Crime: A Historian's Perspective*. Volume 11.1 included an article written by LASA archivist Brenda McCafferty about the Hon. David C. McDonald's role in the creation of the Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS).

Oral History

LASA has initiated a province-wide series of recorded interview projects preserving the memory of the legal community for posterity.

Calgary Project

Most of the previous oral histories have now been transcribed and copies have been sent to the interviewees for a final edit. In 2002, LASA received funding from the Law Society of Alberta and the Calgary Bar Association to revive the program in Calgary. Myrene Hayes was hired to manage the project and Ken Mills became the Chair of this Committee.

Edmonton Project

Work continues in Edmonton led by Norma J. Mitchell and Garth Fryett, Q.C. with the interviews conducted by Ken Tingley.

Peace River and Grande Prairie Project

Work continues on this project funded by the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation. Ken Tingley has been doing the interviews and to date five oral histories have been completed.

Legal History Library

Fifty-eight titles were added to LASA's library, most of which were donated. Substantial donations were made by Joseph P. Brumlik, the Provincial Archives of Alberta and the David C. McDonald fonds. Notable new items include *The Lawmakers : Judicial Power and the Shaping of Canadian Federalism* by John T. Saywell, from the Osgoode Society and the latest volume of *Alberta in the Twentieth Century* published by United Western Communications Ltd..

Auditor's Report

To the Directors of Legal Archives Society of Alberta

We have audited the balance sheet of the Legal Archives Society of Alberta as at October 31, 2002 and the statement of revenue, expenses and net assets for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Society's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statement is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

In common with many charitable organizations, the Society records revenue such as donations and other revenue, the completeness of which is not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Society and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue, surplus of revenue over expenses, assets and net assets.

In our opinion, except for the effect of any adjustments, if any, which we might have determined to be necessary had we been able to verify the completeness of income from donations described in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Society as at October 31, 2002 and the results of its operations for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.





Notes to Financial Statements

1. General

The Society is a non-profit organization incorporated on January 18, 1990. The purpose of the Society is to preserve, promote and understand the evolution of law and society in Alberta.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

The following policies are in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and the recommendations for non-profit organizations as outlined in the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants Handbook.

Management estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Revenue recognition

The Society follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Capital expenditures

All Capital additions are expensed in the year acquired.

Donated collection items

Donated collection items are recorded at estimated fair value, whenever fair market values can be determined. These donated items are reflected as revenue and expense in the year received.

Statement of cash flows

A statement of cash flows has not been prepared as it would not provide further meaningful information.

Financial instruments

The financial instruments of the Society are cash, casino funds - held in trust, due from The Law Society of Alberta and accounts payable.

Comparative figures

Certain prior year figures have been reclassified to conform with the current year's presentation.

3. Casino

Funds generated by the Casino are not for general use. The majority of these funds must be used for qualifying activities in accordance with The Alberta Gaming Control guidelines and distributed to specified community foundations. Revenues of the Casino are recognized when the related expenses or distributions are incurred, with the balance of Casino proceeds recorded as funds held in trust.
