The Legal Archives Society of Alberta (LASA) is dedicated to preserving, promoting and understanding the evolution of law and society in Alberta by establishing and preserving a complete and accurate historical record of the legal profession in Alberta. Incorporated under the *Societies Act of Alberta* in 1990, LASA is governed by an independent Board of Directors.

< Administration and Finances

In 2006/2007, LASA operated on a budget of \$260,000. The Law Society of Alberta provided the core grant of \$120,000.

LASA is a registered charity and holds category “A” status under the Cultural Properties Export and Import Act.

Project Funding

For the fiscal year of 2006/2007 LASA received a total of \$88,200 in project funding or commitments from outside sources to fund specific projects.

Archives Society of Alberta

\$4,950 was received from the ASA (Access to Holdings Program) to prepare records for the Law Society of Alberta

Publications

\$49,000 was received from the Minister of Justice, Calgary Bar Association, and the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation to begin researching and writing a history of the Court of Appeal of Alberta. \$5,800 was received from Alberta Historical Resources Foundation to publish a 2nd edition of *Lords and Ladies of the Western Bench*.

Memorial Bronze Busts

The Community Initiative Program provided LASA \$12,800 to complete the bronze busts of former Chief Justices of Alberta.

2006 Annual Campaign

The purpose of the annual campaign is to raise funds to cover operating expenses for the current and next fiscal year. Staff and volunteer supporters normally set out to achieve the 2006/2007 goal of \$50,000 (before expenses) through two major projects: a direct mail campaign, and the Historical Dinners and auctions. The total of the 2007 campaign was \$43,763.

Direct Mail Campaign

LASA mailed out over 8,500 appeal letters and donor cards to the Alberta legal community in May 2007. Combined with other contributions throughout the year, the profession responded with \$43,763 in direct donations.

Historical Dinners

LASA did not hold a 2007 Historical Dinner, but worked in conjunction with the Law Society on their gala dinner celebrating the centennial. LASA expects to receive the profits from the Law Society dinner which is expected to equal approximately what LASA would generate from its Historical Dinners and Auction.

Alberta Legal Heritage Fund

In 1997 LASA established the Alberta Legal Heritage Fund at the Edmonton Community Foundation, the Calgary Foundation and the Medicine Hat Community Foundation. In 1998, funds were established in the Community Foundations of Red Deer, Lethbridge and Grande Prairie. Funds from casinos held in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2004 were also added to the Alberta Legal Heritage Fund in each community. The income from the funds is used to ensure the future preservation of legal archives in Alberta. In the past year \$13,046 was received in Endowment Income.

Casino

LASA held a charity casino at Casino Calgary on November 13 and 14, 2006. Casino profits are first deposited in a city-wide pool and then distributed. LASA's portion of this profit was received during the 2006/07 fiscal year and amounted to 85,481.21. LASA's next Casino is April 24 & 25, 2008.

Membership

Membership stood at 229 on October 31, 2006, a increase from last year's total of 210. Revenue from annual campaign donations for 2006/2007 was \$43,763 a slight decrease from last year's amount of \$43,811. The average donation in 2005/2006 was \$208; in 2006/2007, it was \$204.

Annual General Meeting

On March 7, 2007, LASA held its Annual General Meeting at the Lougheed House in Calgary. Members of the current Board of Directors, David Bickman, Catherine Christopher, Q.C., Dennis A. McDermott, Q.C., Ken Mills, Wayne Schafer, Q.C. and Neil Watson allowed their names to stand.

Prof. Don Smith from the University of Calgary was the guest speaker and gave an interesting talk and slide show on lawyers who practiced in the Lougheed Building, which was based on his book *Calgary's Grand Story: The Making of a Prairie Metropolis from the Viewpoint of Two Heritage Buildings*.

LASA operates a province-wide archives program and facility based in the Law Society of Alberta offices in Calgary. The main components of the archives function are:

- acquiring and appraising records of the legal community
- arranging, describing, and constructing finding aids for records
- storing and conserving records

Facilities and Conservation

LASA's administrative and research offices and storage vault is limited. In 2006 there was approximately 100 metres of records stored at Iron Mountain. In 2007 LASA transferred 50 boxes (16 metres) of archival records to Iron Mountain for permanent storage.

LASA still requires a long-term solution to archival storage space. Investigation on installing mobile shelving onsite in LASA's office is underway.

Acquisitions

LASA acquired 35 accessions in 2007, amounting to nearly 14.26 linear metres of textual records, over 62 photographs, 9 videos, 3 cultural historic items (wooden case, mallet and trowel), and 9 textiles (judicial apparel). Currently LASA's holdings exceed 550 metres. Noteworthy acquisitions in 2006 include:

< Archives

Accession number 2007-027– **The Honourable Virgil P. Moshansky, Q.C.** Consists of 19 boxes of bench books (judge’s notebooks), compiled by the Honourable Virgil Peter Moshansky, Q.C. Also contains records from the Commission of Inquiry into the Air Ontario Crash in Dryden, Ontario over which Moshansky presided. 24 people were killed in the crash at Dryden which occurred on March 10, 1989. The investigation revealed that a number of factors had contributed to the crash. Most significant was the deadly accumulation of ice on the wings. The changes recommended by the official inquiry altered aircraft safety regulations in Canada.

Date Range: 1976-2003; *Extent:* 6.08 metres of textual records.

Accession number 2007-034 - **The Honourable Edward R. Tavender** of the District Court of Southern Alberta. Records include judge’s notebooks, reasons for judgment, law school note books and year books from the University of Alberta. Photos include two University of Alberta law school composite photos (1923-1924 Juniors and 1927 Law school grads); Canadian Bar Association group of attendees at the R.B. Bennett luncheon at the Banff Springs Hotel on Saturday September 3, 1932; group of four Justices including His Honour E.R. Tavender and Chief Justice S.B. Smith, Elmor B. Feir, and unknown Judge (possibly L.S. Turcotte). Also includes a photo reproduction on publication paper of R.B. Bennett. Edward Rusling Tavender’s Law Society of Alberta admission certificate dated June 13, 1927 is also included in this accession. Tavender began his law career at the Bennett firm.

Date Range: 1923-1978; *Extent:* 1.60 metres of textual records and 4 photographs.

Accession number 2007-022 – **Chester Burns, Q.C.** These papers were donated by Don Thompson, Law Society of Alberta. They were found abandoned in a home outside Calgary. Consists of 26 handwritten volumes with table of contents containing law school notes and assignments completed by Calgary lawyer Chester Vince Burns. Chester Burns was born on May 13, 1916 and died on December 1, 1986. He was admitted to the bar on August 22, 1946, and received his Q.C. on December 30, 1981. Burns attended the University of Alberta Law School, graduating in 1945 (class of 4), and worked as a student-at-law in Calgary with the Fenerty law firm. Later he joined his father, also a lawyer, in practice. Volume titles include: Agency in tort and contract, administrative law, bankruptcy, bills and notes, company law, conflicts of law, constitutional law, contracts, domestic relations, English constitutional history, equity, evidence, insurance, legal history, personal property, practice, real property, sales, surety ship, torts, wills and two papers/essays relating to Shakespeare, Thomas Lodge and Henry VI. Of note are handwritten notes detailing observances made by Chester Burns of Justice William Ives of the Supreme Court of Alberta, as well as an entire volume dedicated to legal history.

Date Range: 1944-1945; *Extent:* 42 cm of text (26 volumes).

Arrangement and Description

The activity of arranging and describing archives involves: accessioning the records to gain physical control; completing a preliminary listing of the material to facilitate access to the holdings; storing material for long-term preservation; and producing finding aids compliant with the *Rules of Archival Description* to aid researchers. A group of records from one person or organization is described in archival terms as a Fonds. Detailed descriptions of all acquisitions received by LASA are available on the automated ACCESSION database. Approximately 75% of LASA's holdings are archivally arranged and described at the fonds and series level on the FONDS database. Of the 111 fonds described, most are processed to the file and item level and include a finding aid available for researchers.

The processing of the papers of the Law Society of Alberta, Member file series was completed last September (approximately 9 metres including 52 volumes of textual records) by contract Archivist Linda Janzen. Grant funding for this project came from the Archives Society of Alberta, Access to Holdings program.

Two other grant submissions to the Canadian Council of Archives NADP program and the Archives Society of Alberta control of holdings program were made in December 2007. LASA received word that it was successful in obtaining \$5,000 to process the papers of the Hon. Asa Milton Harradence, QC. Processing of these papers will begin in the fall of 2008.

Reference Services

LASA maintains an automated reference system which provides access to information on lawyers, legal organizations, and judges in the province and supports research projects such as family histories, case law, and biographies. Staff perform limited searches and interpretation of material in response to reference inquiries.

LASA received 151 requests for information relating to or taken directly from its holdings. Some of these requests involved extensive in-house research of archival material over a period of weeks; others were simple requests for information provided in a matter of minutes over the telephone. The information has been used for locating practice files, to complete genealogical research, or to produce historical publications. The types of researchers were broken down as follows: Donor/Depositor - 36; Legal Community - 51; Academic Community - 5; Private Researchers - 37; Media - 8; Other Archives/Libraries - 14.

Exhibits and Interpretation

Exhibits were prepared for Edmonton and Calgary for the 100-year anniversary of the Law Society of Alberta and the Court of Queen's Bench dinners held on October 4, 2007. An exhibit for the Law Society of Alberta Stamp Launch was prepared for September 13, 2007. Since October 4, the 100-year anniversary displays have been featured at a number of open houses and conferences (book launch at Lougheed House was on October 23, 2007). A replica of the Calgary 100 year decade's exhibit was produced and mounted by *Map World* in the Courthouse Library for permanent display in time for the grand opening held January 25, 2008.

< Other Heritage Programs

Additionally, contributions were made to Archives Society of Alberta (ASA) virtual exhibit featured on www.archivesalberta.org. The 2007 virtual exhibit theme was 'Archives Unleashed – Animals in Archives'. A calendar was produced to supplement the theme with archival images supplied by repositories across Alberta.

Publications

In 2007 LASA published *Just Works: Lawyers in Alberta, 1907-2007* commemorating the centennial of the Law Society of Alberta. The book traces the history of law and legal practice in Alberta from the days of Senator James Lougheed to the present. Major publication projects slated for release in 2008 are a 2nd edition of *Lords and Ladies of the Western Bench* which will be updated to include judges appointed between 1990 and 2005. LASA has commissioned David Mittelstadt, author of *Foundations of Justice*, to research and write a history of the Court of Appeal of Alberta.

Architypes

Two issues of LASA's newsletter, *Architypes*, were distributed to members of the Law Society throughout the year. Volume 15, Issue II featured an excerpt from Peter Hogg's speech entitled "When the West was Won: A Brief History of Alberta's Natural Resources," presented at LASA's annual Historical Dinner in 2006. This issue also featured the reminiscences of the late Hon. Gordon Hollis Allen, Q.C. Volume 16, Issue I, the centennial issue celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Law Society of Alberta, featured the results of the centennial survey published in the previous issue of *Architypes*. This issue also featured a review of the recently-released book *Behind the Man: John Laurie, Ruth Gorman, and the Indian Vote in Canada*.

Oral History

LASA has initiated a province-wide series of recorded interview projects preserving the memory of the legal community for posterity. Most of the previous year's oral histories have now been transcribed and copies have been sent to the interviewees for a final edit.

Calgary Project

March 2008 will mark two years of interviews for the latest round of LASA's oral history program. 32 interviews have been completed with ten more in progress or pending. Subjects have included judges, litigators, small town lawyers and senior female practitioners. Highlights have been interviews with Justice A.M. Harradence; Justice E.A. McFadyen; lawyers and politicians Stan Schumacher and Garth Turcott; and litigators such as David Haigh of Burnett Duckworth and David Tavender of Fraser Milner Casgrain.

Ken Mills is the Chair of the Calgary Committee and David Mittelstadt conducted most of the interviews.

Edmonton Project

Work continues in Edmonton led by Garth Fryett, Q.C. and Don Bishop, Q.C.

Legal History Library

LASA's received several donated books in 2007 and would like to thank all of those people who generously contributed to LASA growing collection. Some of the highlights added to LASA's library include: Robert J. Sharpe and Patricia I. MaMahon, *The Persons Case: The Origins and Legacy of the Fight for Legal Personhood*; Lori Chambers, *Misconceptions: Unmarried Motherhood and the Ontario Children of Unmarried Parents Act, 1921-1969*; Martin L. Friedland, *My Life in Crime and Other Academic Adventures*. 2007 was the year to celebrate legal milestones and 3 books were published commemorating these achievements: Jonathon Swainger (ed.), *The Supreme Court of Alberta at 100: History and Authority*; Iain A. Mentiplay, Q.C., *A Century of Integrity: The Law Society of Saskatchewan, 1907-2007*; and finally LASA published its own book tracing the development of law in Alberta with a generous grant from the Law Society of Alberta titled *Just Works: Lawyers in Alberta, 1907-2007*.

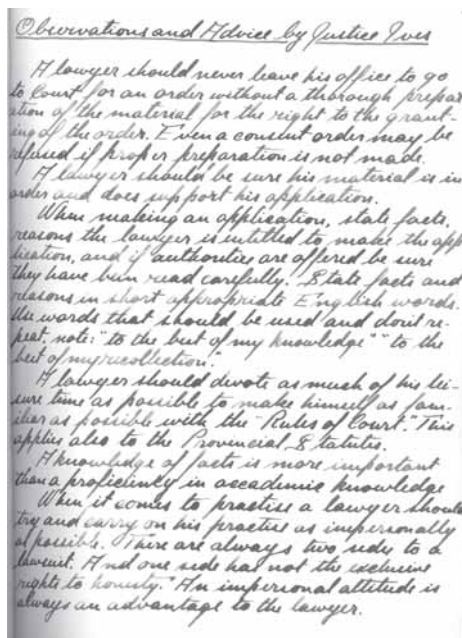
